Jonathan B. Kotch, MD, MPH, MA, FAAP, is a board certified specialist in both pediatrics and preventive medicine. He attended Columbia University, graduating summa cum laude, received his medical degree from Stanford University, and his Master of Public Health in Maternal and Child Health from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. In addition, he earned an M.A. in social anthropology (first class honours) from King's College, Cambridge.

Dr. Kotch is the Carol Remmer Angle Professor of Children's Environmental Health in the Department of Maternal and Child Health of the UNC Gillings School of Global Public Health at The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He is an affiliated faculty member of UNC's Injury Prevention Research Center and a Senior Fellow of the Frank Porter Graham Child Development Institute. His specific areas of interest include child abuse and neglect, injury prevention, and health and safety in child care. Dr. Kotch's externally-funded projects include a longitudinal study of children at risk of child abuse and neglect and studies of health and safety in child care facilities. Currently he is the Project Director of the National Training Institute for Child Care Health Consultants, funded by the Maternal and Child Health Bureau of the US Department of Health and Human Services. He also directs the North Carolina Child Care Health and Safety Resource Center of the North Carolina Family Health Resource Line, funded by the Divisions of Public Health and Child Development of the state of North Carolina. In addition he is the PI of Promoting Nutrition and Physical Activity in Child Care and Connecting the Dots, both funded by the Maternal and Child Health Bureau, and Family Friendly Child Care, funded by The Duke Endowment. He has over 70 articles published or in press with scientific journals and edits a popular Maternal and Child Health textbook.
